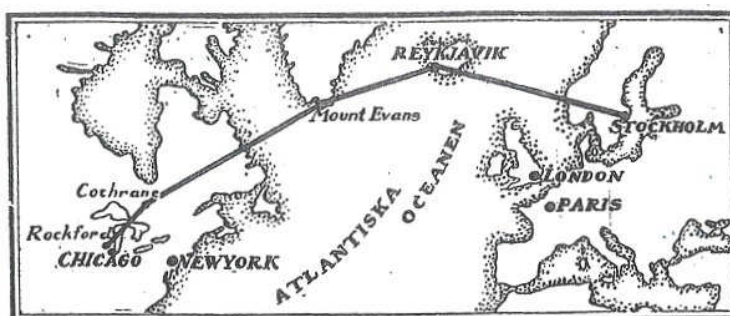
Attempted Flight from Rockford, Illinois, USA to Stockholm, Sweden 16 August 1930
