

# Gothenburg - Esbjerg - Felixtown

5-6 August 1919

Airmail fee: 0 öre



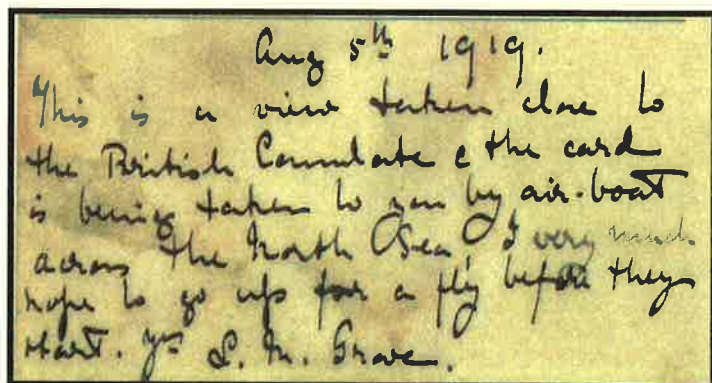
Postcard flown from Gothenburg August 5, 1919 to the town Esbjerg in Denmark (flown from Esbjerg on August 6) and then to the town Felixtown, in England, and the card arrival stamped in Felixtown on August 7. The text on the card it says that the cards flown over the North Sea.

On the July 11, 1919 the flying-boat F5, N4044, started from Felixtown, in England, to fly to Scandinavia. The flight has been issued by the Air Ministry and was made entirely as a demonstration of the commercial uses of flying-boats. There were four people in the airplane; First pilot Major Golpin, second pilot Captain Charles Scott, navigator Captain Nuán and mechanic Dickley. They flew from Felixtown to Christiansand, Oslo, Copenhagen, Stockholm, Gotheburg, Esbjerg and then back to Felixtown on the August 6, 1919 over the North Sea.

No official mail carried on this airroute, but the shown private card has flown from Gothenburg, on August 5, to Felixtown.

The card's interesting and important text is the following;

*Aug 5th 1919  
This is a view taken close to the British Comandate e the card is being taken to you by air-boat across the North Sea, I very much hope to go up for a fly before they start. Yours L.M Grave*



The card is signed by the first pilot Major Golpin (who was head of the flight). The card is also signed by the second pilot Captain Charles Scott - "Scott Seaplane 4044"
